## NOTES TO BALANCE SHEETS AND INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

## Significant Accounting Policies:

a. Basis of accounting and Preparation of Financial Statement: The Financial Statements are prepared under historical cost convention on accrual basis of accounting complying in all material aspects with applicable Accounting Principles and the Accounting Standard generally accepted in India.

## b. Revenue Recognition:

Income is recognized on cash basis.

- All donations are recognized as income and accounted on receipt of donations
- Government grant is recognized on accrual basis.
- c. Property, Plant and Equipment
  Fixed assets are stated at their historical cost of acquisition or

construction, less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes all cost incurred to bring the asset to their working condition and location.

## d. Employee Benefits:

Financial Statements are prepared on cash basis. Retirement benefits to employees will be recognized and accounted in the year they arise.
